Bo'ness Industrial Pottery Society

Bo'ness Industrial Pottery Society was formed by Bo'ness Co-op Society following meeting in March 1887. The pottery was built at Grangepans in 1889. the company went into liquidation in 1894.

West Lothian Pottery Co took over pottery at Grangepans established by the Bo'ness Industrial Co-operative Society Ltd from 1897 to 1929.

C W McNay & Sons

Pottery company, Bo'ness. Watson McNay left Bo'ness Pottery to establish Bridgeness Pottery in 1886. He brought four workers with him. When the Bo'ness Pottery closed in 1899, Bridgeness acquired much of its trade. Bridgeness Pottery closed in the 1950s. Bridgeness Pottery produced tableware and a wide selection of transfer designs and embossed plain whiteware. Whiteware was produced for the armed forces and Woolworth's. It also produced cottage ornaments such as cats, wally dugs and parrots.
