Dunipace Parish Church finding aid

The parish of Dunipace was a pre-reformation parish which was appropriated to the Abbey of Cambuskenneth. The quoad omnia parish was united with the parish of Larbert by Act of Parliament in 1617, confirmed by Act of Parliament in 1624, but each retained its own church building. A mission chapel was set up from Dunipace Parish Church in Carronshore in the nineteenth century. A portion of the parish was removed in 1878 to form part of the quoad sacra parish of Bonnybridge. The congregation took the name Larbert & Dunipace Old Parish Church in 1929 and then became Dunipace Old Parish Church in 1962 after the union with Larbert was dissolved. Dunipace Old was linked with Dunipace North on 20 Mar 1964 and the two congregations united on 8 January 1989 as Dunipace Parish Church.

The Church of Scotland kirk session for Larbert and Dunipace sat within the presbytery of Stirling until 1929. It then sat within the presbytery of Linlithgow and Falkirk and from 1976 in the presbytery of Falkirk.
