Forbes of Callendar Papers finding aid (1531-1974) Introduction

This collection consists of 36m of records of the Forbes of Callendar family from 1531-1974. The records have been arranged into twenty eight series (see next page for details) and the finding aid has been separated into these series to make it easier to download from our website.

History of Forbes of Callendar family

The Forbes family originated in Aberdeenshire and ran a coppersmith business in Aberdeen. In the 1760s and 1770s the business expanded to London, where William Forbes established a separate coppersmith business. William Forbes purchased Callendar Estates and Almond Estates in 1783, and added estates in Earlstoun in Dumfries, Sanquhar in Ayrshire and Herbertshire in Denny. Callendar House was bought as part of Callendar Estates but was sold in 1963 along with parts of Callendar Park to Falkirk Town Council. The family continue to own Callendar Estates.

The second William Forbes (1806-1855) was only nine years old when his father died and his estates were therefore managed by Trustees until he reached his majority at age 25 in 1831. He married Lady Louisa Charteris, daughter of the Earl of Wemyss. He was the Conservative MP for Stirlingshire , 1835-1837 and 1841-1855.

The third William Forbes (1833-1914) was born in Edinburgh and educated at Eton and Christ Church, Oxford. He married Rose O'Hara in 1859 and the couple had two sons, William and John, both of whom pre-deceased their father. William's second wife was Edith Harvey, and they had three sons and four daughters. Their second son, Charles William Forbes, (1871-1948) inherited Callendar Estates. He was vice president of the Unionist Association, Commissioner of Supply, Commissioner under the Property and Income Tax Act, 1895, JP. He was also the first person to be given the Freedom of the Burgh of Falkirk in 1906.

The fourth Forbes to own Callendar Estates was Colonel Charles William Forbes (1871-1948). He married Jean Hotham in 1897 (daughter of Vice Admiral Sir Charles Hatham) and had three sons and four daughters (two died in Second World War). He was educated at Eton and Christ Church, Oxford and was Captain of Stirling County Cricket Club, 1896-1909. (Obituary in Falkirk Herald, 7 August 1948)

Arrangement

The correspondence was originally arranged in chronological order, regardless of topic. It has now been re-arranged into smaller bundles relating to particular topics. These bundles of letters to William Forbes of Callendar often include drafts or copies of his replies. Minor correspondence, particularly from tradesmen, will also be found among the receipts and vouchers in the estate papers.
