#### Ironfounding Workers Association finding aid

The Ironfounding Workers Association began in 1889 as the Central Ironmoulders' Association of Scotland. In 1892 new District branches were set up in Edinburgh and Glasgow and in 1896 an Executive Council was set up. It appears that the name was changed at this point and the original organisation became the Central District of the Ironfounding Workers Association. In 1897 there were five districts: Central, Southern, Northern, Glasgow and Edinburgh. Branches in England were organised from 1906 onwards. In 1939 the main offices were still in Falkirk. On 1 July 1946 the Ironfounding Workers Association became part of the Amalgamated Union of Foundry Workers of Great Britain and Ireland.
