Redding Pit Disaster Inquiry finding aid

The Redding Pit Disaster Inquiry was held in 1924, in response to the flooding of Pit 23 of Redding Colliery on 25 September 1923 in which 40 men died. The records listed in this finding aid originate from Drummond Miller LLP, a firm of solicitors which (as Drummond & Reid) was involved in the inquiry.
